The Executive Committee having received the results of the investigation into the alleged misconduct of and in conformity with its rules now makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

Rand Weborg:

1. was initially certified as a Certified Alcohol/Drug Counselor III on April 10, 1993;
2. was a counselor under WCB jurisdiction at the time of the alleged offenses identified within the complaint; and remains a counselor under WCB jurisdiction;
3. admitted to having an intimate sexual relationship with a woman identified as MZ prior to and after her admission to Koinonia Residential Treatment Center where the respondent was employed;
4. in June, 1997 chose not to transfer M.Z. from Koinonia to another agency, nor did the respondent choose to discuss the case with his supervisor, the complainant.
5. resigned his position at Koinonia Residential Treatment Center;
6. was reported to the State of Wisconsin pursuant to the Caregiver Act by Mark Strosahl; and
7. In August, 1999, M.Z., died as passenger in an auto accident. M.Z.'s BAL was .395.

CONCLUSION

The Executive Committee concludes that the respondent, Rand Weborg, breached the following Rules contained within the Counselor *Code of Conduct*:

Rule 2.2 – A counselor shall not engage in conduct which does not meet the generally accepted standards of practice.

Rule 4.1 – A counselor shall not engage in any form of sexual contact/behavior with clients, nor engage in any form of sexual contact/behavior with former therapy clients for two years after the cessation or termination of professional services within the client's continuum of care. The prohibition shall apply with respect to any client/patient of the agency by which the counselor is employed, regardless of whether or not the client/patient is on the counselor's caseload.


Rule 6.1 – A counselor shall not develop, implement, or maintain exploitative relationships with current or past clients.

DECISION

Pursuant to Section V(A)(3) of the WCB Counselor Code of Conduct, Action by the Executive Committee, Rand Weborg's certification as a Certified Alcohol/Drug Counselor III is hereby revoked.

Please be advised of your rights to appeal, hearing, and reinstatement as outlined within the counselor Code of Conduct, Sections VI and Section VII.
