The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Department Secretary. The Department Secretary has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department Secretary adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Cherylann Kelly, 1022 East Potter Avenue, Milwaukee, WI, is not and was not at any time relevant to this action licensed to practice massage therapy and bodywork.

2. From March 20, 2000, to April 26, 2001, Ms. Kelly engaged in the practice of massage therapy and bodywork at Healthreach Rehabilitation Services, a healthcare provider located at 17280 West North Avenue, Suite 104, Brookfield, WI.
3. Kelly understands that she needs a license to practice massage therapy and bodywork in Wisconsin. In resolution of this matter, she consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Department of Regulation and Licensing has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to § 440.21, Stats.
2. Wis. Stats. § 440.981 requires a license to practice massage therapy and bodywork in Wisconsin.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, **IT IS ORDERED** that Cherylann Kelly is ENJOINED and PROHIBITED as follows:

1. SHE SHALL NOT PRACTICE OR OFFER TO PRACTICE MASSAGE THERAPY AND BODYWORK in Wisconsin unless and UNTIL she obtains a license from the Department of Regulation and Licensing.
2. **Violation of the order in paragraph 1 above may result in a forfeiture of up to \$10,000 for each offense. Each day a violation continues is considered a separate offense.**
3. This Order shall become effective on the date of its signing.
