PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Chiropractic Examining Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Glen J. Murphy, D.C., (DOB 04/10/1957), Respondent, is duly licensed as a chiropractor in the state of Wisconsin (license #12-2384). This license was granted on 12/01/1988.
2. On or about September 13, 2005, Respondent was found guilty by the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin on seven counts of filing false tax returns and three counts of willfully failing to file income tax returns in *United States v. Glen Murphy*, United States District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin, No. 04-CR-280. A true and correct copy of the Indictment and Judgment are attached as Exhibits A and B.
3. Respondent was incarcerated in federal prison from September 13, 2005 and continuing on through March 12, 2008 when he was released to a halfway house until May 19, 2008. Respondent was then put on home confinement. While in the halfway house and on home confinement, Respondent was able to work but did not practice chiropractic until after August 13, 2008.

4. Beginning on August 14, 2008, Respondent began to practice chiropractic as an employee of and under the supervision of Kent Albrecht, D.C.

5. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 446.03, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraph 2, above, constitutes a violation of Wis. Admin. Code § Chir 6.02(24).

### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The license of Glen J. Murphy, D.C. (license #12-2384), to practice as a chiropractor in the State of Wisconsin is hereby SUSPENDED for 2 years 11 months, applied retroactively, from September 13, 2005 and continuing on through August 13, 2008.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the license to practice chiropractic of Glen J. Murphy, D.C., is LIMITED in the following respects for a period of not less than 2 years:

2. Respondent shall arrange to have reports submitted from his parole officer for the duration of his parole.

3. Respondent shall obtain a Professional Mentor acceptable to the Board. The Board approves Kent Albrecht, D.C., to serve as the Professional Mentor. The Professional Mentor shall be the individual responsible for reviewing and supervising Respondent's practice of chiropractic during the time this Order is in effect.

4. Supervision shall include monthly meetings, review of no fewer than 12 charts, or all active charts if Respondent has less than 12, selected by the Professional Mentor, and any other actions deemed appropriate by the Professional Mentor to determine that Respondent is practicing, charting and billing in a professional and competent manner.

5. Respondent shall arrange for his Professional Mentor to provide written reports to the Department Monitor in the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin 53708-8935 on a quarterly basis, as directed by the Department Monitor. These reports shall assess Respondent's professional performance, chart quality and billing practices.

6. Respondent's Professional Mentor shall immediately report to the Department Monitor any conduct of the Respondent which may constitute unprofessional conduct, a violation of this Order, or a danger to the public or patient.

7. The Board shall review the required frequency of meetings after six months, and may decrease or increase them, based on the reports received. Respondent may petition the Board for termination of the requirement for a Professional Mentor after one year of positive reports.

8. Respondent shall not act as a preceptor under Wis. Adm. Code ch. Chir 9, at any time while his license is limited.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

9. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). Payment shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, and mailed to:
