: PROPOSED DECISION

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FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Jill L. Broihahn, hereinafter called the Respondent, was at all times material to this proceeding duly licensed under the provisions of Chapter 441, Wisconsin Statutes, to practice as a registered nurse in the State of Wisconsin.
2. That the Respondent's registered nurse license is number 69345, issued on October 28, 1977.
3. That the Respondent's last address reported to the Board of Nursing is 218 N. Church, Elkhorn, Wisconsin 53121.
4. That while working as the Director of Nursing at the Lake Geneva Nursing Home, Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, the Respondent made alterations to the clinical record of a patient as follows:
 - a. On or about March 10, 1981, added the words "call bell at bedside" to the notes for the 11-7 shift for March 10, 1981.
 - b. On or about March 10, 1981, added the words "call bell at bedside" to the notes for the 7-3 shift for March 10, 1981.
 - c. On or about March 11, 1981, added the words "call bell at bedside" to the notes for the 11-7 shift for March 11, 1981.
 - d. On or about March 26, 1981, added the words "skin breakdown" to the notes for the 7-3 shift for March 26, 1981.
5. That the alterations to the records were made by the Respondent for purposes of making a more complete record.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That by engaging in the activities set forth above, the Respondent has engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wisconsin Administrative Code sec. N 11.04.

2. That the Board of Nursing has jurisdiction pursuant to sec. 441.07, Wisconsin Statutes, to take disciplinary action against the Respondent for the violations set forth above.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, that the Respondent shall be and hereby is REPRIMANDED.
