A party aggrieved by this decision may petition the board for rehearing within twenty (20) days after service of this decision pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 227.12. The petition in this instance would be captioned with Therese Marie Jasinski, T.P.N. as the respondent.

A party aggrieved by this decision may also petition for judicial review by filing the petition in the office of the clerk of the circuit court for the county where the judicial review proceedings will be held and serving the Board or other parties with a copy of the petition for judicial review within thirty (30) days after service of this decision pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 227.16. The party to be named as respondent in said petition would be the State of Wisconsin Board of Nursing.

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. At all times relevant to this action, Therese Marie Jasinski, T.P.N., was duly licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a trained practical nurse, (license #3251); this license was issued on January 8, 1960.

- 2. On or about May 21, 1981 Ms. Jasinski diverted three (3) Chlorodiaxapoxide (Librium) capsules from the PRN patient supply of patient M.P. at Shorehaven Nursing Home.
 - 3. Chlorodiaxapoxide is a Schedule IV controlled substance.
- 4. Ms. Jasinski diverted the Chlorodiaxapoxide referred to above for her own personal use.
- 5. On January 6, 1982 Ms. Jasinski was convicted on a plea of no contest to a charge of disorderly conduct based upon her May 21, 1981 diversion of Chlorodiaxapoxide from Shorehaven Nursing Home.
- 6. On May 3, 1983 Ms. Jasinski was evaluated for chemical dependency at Kettle Moraine Treatment Center in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin. This treatment center has been certified by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals as meeting that body's alcohol and drug program standards. The evaluation found her to be not chemically dependent at the time of the evaluation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Ms. Jasinski, by her unlawful diversion of a controlled substance from the supplies of a patient assigned to her care is subject to disciplinary action against her license under Wis. Stats. sec. 441.07(1)(c) and (d) and Wis. Adm. Code secs. N11.03(3)(a) and (b) and N11.04(1).

Therefore, it is hereby ORDERED:

The license of Therese Marie Jasinski to practice as a trained practical nurse is suspended for a period of thirty (30) days. The Board has considered Ms. Jasinski's request for a retroactive application of this suspension, or alternatively, a stay of suspension, and further orders that the suspension be stayed pending completion of the period of license limitation outlined below.

The license of Ms. Jasinski is further limited as follows:

Ms. Jasinski shall be responsible for the submission on a quarterly basis reports on her work performance directly from her current employer to the Bureau of Nursing. This limitation shall commence upon July 28, 1983 and shall expire on July 28, 1984.

STIPULATION

THERESE MARIE JASINSKI, L.P.N.:

RESPONDENT. :

It is hereby stipulated between Therese Marie Jasinski, L.P.N., personally and by her attorney Peter Plaushines, and Steven M. Gloe, attorney for the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows that:

- This stipulation shall be submitted to the Board of Nursing along with the attached Final Decision and Order in resolution of this matter.
- If the terms of this stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this stipulation, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further action.
- If the Board accepts the terms of the stipulation, the parties to this action consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance, or consent of the parties.
- Ms. Jasinski understands that by the signing of this stipulation she voluntarily and knowingly waives her rights, including: the right to a hearing on the allegations against her, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by clear, satisfactory and convincing evidence; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to call witnesses on her behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena; the right to testify herself; the right to file objections to any proposed decision to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decisions; the rights to petition for rehearing; and all other applicable rights afforded to Ms. Jasinski under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- In settlement of this matter, Ms. Jasinski agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Board of Nursing. The Final Decision and Order, as attached, is incorporated as a part of this stipulation. Also incorporated within this stipulation is the attached chemical dependency assessment of Ms. Jasinski by Kettle Moraine Treatment Center.

6. The Division of Enforcement joins Ms. Jasinski in recommending the Board of Nursing adopt this stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
