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IN THE MATTER OF DISCIPLINARY
PROCEEDINGS AGAINST

FINAL DECISION
AND ORDER

Based upon the Stipulation and upon the pleadings in this matter, the

Medical Examining Board makes the following order:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED that the attached Stipulation in this matter, including Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained therein be, and hereby is, accepted and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the license to practice medicine and surgery of Bruce Krygowski, M.D., be and hereby is suspended for a period of three months commencing April 19, 1985 and terminating on July 19, 1985.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that on July 20, 1985, the license of Bruce Krygowski, M.D. to practice as a physician surgeon in the State of Wisconsin be reinstated as a limited license for a period of three years terminating on July 20, 1988. The terms and conditions of the limitation are as follows:

1. Respondent shall commence the practice of medicine in the State of Wisconsin under the supervision of a physician who is in good standing with the medical authorities of this state and who shall be registered with the Drug Enforcement Administration and shall not have committed any violations of the Controlled Substances Act, or any state law relating to controlled substances. Respondent shall identify the physician for board approval prior to Respondent's entering into practice in the State of Wisconsin. The physician so identified shall provide the Medical Examining Board with a letter indicating his acceptance of the terms and conditions of this Stipulation and his willingness to participate in the supervision of Respondent prior to starting to practice medicine in Wisconsin. In the event Respondent chooses to relocate his practice in the State of Wisconsin prior to the termination of his agreement with the Drug Enforcement Administration, Respondent will provide the name and address of a substitute supervising physician who meets the criteria set forth herein.

2. Respondent shall submit to the Medical Examining Board, on a quarterly basis beginning on November 30, 1985 until the end of the limited license, a log which accurately reflects all controlled substances ordered, administered, dispensed or prescribed by Respondent. This log will contain a notation reflecting each transaction Respondent engages in which involves controlled substances in the following manner: (1) the date upon which Respondent orders, administers, dispenses or prescribes a controlled substance; (2) the particular controlled substance ordered, administered, dispensed or prescribed and the purpose for such occurrence; and (3) the quantity of controlled substance ordered, administered, dispensed or prescribed on each date. The supervision referred to herein means only that the supervising physician shall approve and countersign the log containing all controlled substances ordered, administered, dispensed or prescribed by Respondent the supervising physician has no responsibility to supervise in any way the practice of medicine by Respondent except as specifically stated herein above.

3. The physician identified under the terms of paragraph 14(A) above shall agree to countersign the log before it is submitted to the Medical Examining Board each quarter. This countersignature shall indicate that

the physician is aware that this log reflects a true and accurate accounting of all controlled substances activities by Respondent.

4. The above limitations contained in paragraphs 14(A) through 14(C) shall commence on July 20, 1985 and terminate on July 20, 1988.

5. Respondent shall appear before the Medical Examining Board at its scheduled meeting on October 24, 1985. At that time, Respondent further shall to provide the Board with a report regarding the nature of his medical practice prepared by the Chief of Staff of any hospital in which Respondent may have privileges.
