A party aggrieved by this decision may petition the Board for rehearing within twenty (20) days after service of this decision pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 227.12. The petition in this instance would be captioned with Anne Love as the respondent.

A party aggrieved by this decision who is a resident of this state may also petition for judicial review by filing the petition in the office of the clerk of the circuit court for the county where the party aggrieved resides within thirty (30) days after service of this decision. A party aggrieved by this decision who is not a resident of this state must file the petition for judicial review in the office of the clerk of circuit court for Dane County. A party aggrieved must also serve the board and other parties with a copy of the petition for judicial review within thirty (30) days after service of this decision pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 227.16. The party to be named as respondent in the petition is the State of Wisconsin Board of Nursing.

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached stipulation.

Therefore, it is hereby ORDERED:

The Board of Nursing accepts the voluntary surrender of the license to practice as a registered nurse of Anne M. Love.

In the event that Ms. Love reapplies for licensure, and only in the event of her reapplication, the Board may consider the allegations of the informal complaint (case file #84 NURSE 77) as true.

STIPULATION

ANNE M. LOVE, R.N., RESPONDENT.

It is hereby stipulated between Anne M. Love, R.N. personally on her own behalf and Steven M. Gloe, attorney for the Department of Regulation & Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows that:

- This stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation of Ms. Love's licensure by the Division of Enforcement (case file number 84 Nurse 77). Ms. Love consents to the resolution of this investigation by stipulation and without the issuance of a formal complaint.
- Ms. Love understands that by the signing of this stipulation she voluntarily and knowingly waives her right to a hearing on the allegations against her.
- Ms. Love agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Board of Nursing.
- If the terms of this stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this stipulation, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings.
- If the Board accepts the terms of this stipulation, the parties to this stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties.
- Ms. Love hereby agrees to surrender her license to practice as a registered nurse in the State of Wisconsin. Ms. Love has submitted her licensure card to the Division of Enforcement. If the Board does not accept this stipulation, the license of Ms. Love shall be returned to her with the notice of the Board's decision not to accept the stipulation.
- The Division of Enforcement joins Ms. Love in recommending the Board of Nursing adopt this stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
