IN THE MATTER OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS AGAINST

ORDER MODIFYING
THE LIMITED LICENSE

JACK ROBERT HERKOWSKI, R.N., : RESPONDENT. :

By its Order dated February 18, 1987, respondent was granted a limited license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin. Included among the conditions and limitations were that respondent attend weekly therapy sessions with a therapist satisfactory to the board, and that he be monitored for controlled substances and alcohol on a weekly basis.

By letter dated April 23, 1987, respondent petitioned the board to reduce therapy sessions to once every two weeks, and to reduce random urine screens to once every two weeks. DePaul Rehabilitation Hospital Impaired Physicians Program also recommended these modifications. The board considered the matter at its meeting of May 14, 1987.

Based upon respondent's petition, and other documents of record herein, the Board of Nursing modifies its Order of February 18, 1987, to read as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Jack Robert Herkowski, R.N., be and hereby is, granted a limited license to practice as a professional nurse in Wisconsin imposing the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The term of the limited license shall be for three months. Respondent may apply for consecutive three-month renewals of his limited license, which shall be granted upon respondent's acceptable demonstration of compliance with the conditions and limitations set forth herein.
- 2. Upon successful compliance with the terms and conditions set forth herein for a period of two years, commencing March 1, 1986, the board shall grant a petition by respondent for full licensure.
- 3. Respondent shall for the term of the limited license participate in the DePaul Rehabilitation Hospital's Impaired Professional Program, and shall as well participate in twice monthly therapy with a therapist satisfactory to the board. Respondent shall be responsible for submission to the board on a quarterly basis of written reports prepared by his treating therapist outlining respondent's progress in treatment and confirming his continuing ability to safely practice as a registered nurse.
- 4. Respondent shall not consume any unprescribed controlled substances and shall abstain from any and all personal use of alcohol.
- 5. Respondent shall participate in a program of random and witnessed monitoring of his blood or urine for the presence of controlled substances and alcohol. Monitoring shall take place once every two weeks. To be an

acceptable program, the monitoring facility must agree to file an immediate report with the Board of Nursing in the event that respondent fails to appear upon request, the monitoring screen proves positive, or the respondent refuses to provide a specimen. In the event of a positive screen, the monitoring facility must agree to retain the specimen for provision to the board.

- Applicant shall be responsible for submission to the board of quarterly written reports setting forth applicant's status in the monitoring program.
- Applicant shall not be employed in a position where he is granted access to controlled substances.
- Applicant shall be responsible for submission to the board of quarterly written reports from his current employer setting forth applicant's activities and performance in his employment.
 - 9. Applicant shall attend A.A. meetings a minimum of once each week.
- 10. Upon request of the board, applicant shall provide current releases to any affected treatment facilities and personnel complying with state and federal laws, authorizing release of all his medical and treatment records to the Board of Nursing. Copies of said releases shall be filed simultaneously with the Board.
- 11. Violation of any of the terms or limitations may result in summary suspension of applicant's limited license and/or the imposition of further discipline as the board may deem appropriate.
