The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Roger H. Strube, M.D., Respondent, date of birth August 27, 1942, is a physician licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin; his license which bears #16850 was granted July 9, 1969.
- 2. That at all times relevant to this matter Respondent was practicing in South Milwaukee, Wisconsin and was specializing in the area of family practice. That Respondent is not now currently engaged in family practice.
- 3. Since November 1, 1987, Wis. Adm. Code 10.02(2)(s) has prohibited the prescribing of any amphetamine, designated as a Schedule II controlled substance, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 161, Stats., to or for any person except for the treatment of narcolepsy, or the treatment of hyperkinesis, or for the treatment of drug induced brain dysfunction, or for the treatment of epilepsy, or for the differential diagnostic psychiatric

evaluation of depression or for the treatment of depression shown to be refractory to other therapeutic modalities, or for the clinical investigation of the effects of such drugs or compounds, in which case an investigative protocol therefore shall have been submitted to and reviewed and approved by the Board before such investigation has begun.

4. Dexedrine is a brand of dextroamphetamine, a sympathomimetic amine of the amphetamine group, and a Schedule II controlled substance as defined by sec. 161.16(5)(a), Stats.

#### COUNTS I AND II

- 5. That Respondent treated Patient A during the periods August 9, 1973 through July 14, 1975 and October 1978 through April 1983 for depression by prescribing Dexedrine for Patient A.
- 6. That Respondent treated Patient B during the period July 19, 1976 through June 1983 for depression by prescribing Dexedrine for Patient B.
- 7. That Respondent did not attempt to treat either Patient for depression with any other treatment modality and did not make inquiry of any other health care provider who had treated either Patient what treatment had been attempted for their depression.

#### ALL COUNTS

- 8. That neither Patient A nor Patient B will cooperate with the prosecution of this Complaint.
- 9. That Respondent has, at his own expense, voluntarily attended and successfully completed a continuing medical education course entitled "Protecting Your Medical Practice: Clinical, Legal and Ethical Issues in Prescribing Abusable Drugs" on November 16, 17 and 18, 1988 at Tampa, Florida, which program was jointly sponsored by the University of South Florida College of Medicine, Department of Continuing Medical Education, and the Florida Medical Association. The course provides 21 hours of Category I continuing medical education credits. A copy of the program brochure is attached and marked Exhibit A.
- 10. That neither the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing nor the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board have ever received other complaints regarding Respondent.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. That the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to sec. 448.02(3), Wis. Stats.
- 2. That the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has authority to enter into the stipulated resolution, pursuant to sec. 227.44(5), Wis. Stats.
- 3. That by prescribing Schedule II amphetamines to Patient A and Patient B for depression, without first attempting other treatment modalities or verifying that other treatment modalities had been attempted by other health care providers, Respondent has violated Wis. Adm. Code sec. Med 10.02(2)(s) and sec. 448.02(3), Wis. Stats.

#### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Roger H. Strube, M.D., shall attend and successfully complete a medical educational course offering at least 21 Category I continuing medical education credits on the subject of the clinical, legal and ethical issues in prescribing abusable drugs.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Roger H. Strube, M.D. having attended and successfully completed the medical education course entitled "Protecting Your Medical Practice: Clinical, Legal and Ethical Issues in Prescribing Abusable Drugs" offered November 16, 17 and 18, 1988 at Tampa, Florida, which program was jointly sponsored by the University of South Florida College of Medicine, Department of Continuing Medical Education and the Florida Medical Association satisfies the educational requirement set out in the preceding paragraph of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Count III of the Complaint is hereby dismissed.

It is hereby stipulated and agreed, by and between, Roger H. Strube, M.D., Respondent; Wm. Pharis Horton, attorney for Respondent; John R. Zwieg, attorney for the Complainant, Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement; and the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board, as follows:

- 1. That this Stipulation may be submitted directly to the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board and need not be submitted to Donald R. Rittel, the hearing examiner appointed in this matter.
- 2. That in the event that any portion of this Stipulation or proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order or Final Decision is not accepted by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board that the entire Stipulation and proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order and Final Decision shall be void and have no effect. In the event that this resolution is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been biased in any manner as a result of these documents being presented to the Board in this attempted resolution.
- 3. That the Respondent and the attorneys for the parties may appear before the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board and argue in favor of acceptance of this Stipulation and the entry and issuance of the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 4. That Respondent does not admit the conduct set out in the Findings of Fact, but for personal reasons agrees for purposes of this action only that the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board may make and enter the attached Final Decision and Order, without prior notice to any party.
- 5. That in return for Respondent agreeing to the entry and issuance of the attached Final Decision and Order, Complainant hereby moves the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board for an Order dismissing Count III of the Complaint.

- 6. That based upon the motion of Complainant, the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board agrees to dismiss Count III of the Complaint.
- 7. That the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to sec. 448.02(3), Wis. Stats.
- 8. That the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has authority pursuant to sec. 227.44(5), Wis. Stats., to resolve this contested case by stipulation.
