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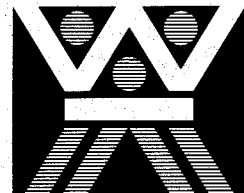

The Executive Committee of the Wisconsin Alcoholism & Drug Counselor Certification Board, Inc. (WADCCB) having results of the investigation into the alleged misconduct of James Mason on now makes the following:

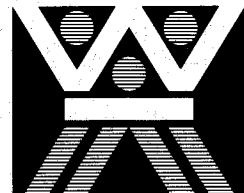
Findings of Fact

1. James Mason admitted to sexual misconduct with clients during 1986 while the priest at the Roncalli Newman Center in Ladrosse.
2. An intervention was done by the Archbishop, and Father Mason placed himself in therapy at Servants of Paraclete, Jemez Springs, NM.
3. Jay R. Feierman, M.D., Consulting Psychiatrist, Servants of Paraclete states that "As a result of treatment, I believe that James Mason is less likely to engage in future sexual misconduct than another person who has never gone through such treatment."
4. The Servants of Paraclete refused the Wisconsin Alcoholism & Drug Counselor Certification Board, Inc. (WADCCB) access to James mason's client file after presentation of a duly authorized request from Mason.
5. Mr. Lester Brown, Mr. Mason's present supervisor, has submitted testimony to the appropriateness of Mr. Mason's present conduct with clients.

CONCLUSIONS

1. James Mason did perform acts of sexual misconduct during his pastoral counseling.
2. James Mason appears to have successfully completed treatment.

Therefore, James Mason did violate portions of the Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct as follows:



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RULES CONCERNING PROFESSIONAL INTEGRITY

1. b. A counselor shall not have a sexual relationship with a client at any stage in the client's treatment process, nor for one year following discharge from all elements of the treatment continuum.

DECISION

Based on the above findings and conclusions, James Mason may now continue in the WADCCB certification process.

The following condition is placed upon Mr. Mason: For a period of time beginning August 16, 1991 and ending on the date Mr. Mason has been certified for a period of two years, Mr. Mason will ask his employer/supervisor to submit to the Executive Committee a letter which describes the nature and extent of one-to-one client contact and a report on his professional conduct. These letters shall be submitted at 6 month intervals.
