ORDER GRANTING THE LIMITED LICENSE

On April 21, 1991, Gregory B. Jackson filed his petition for grant of a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin. On June 20, 1991, and again on July 24, 1991, the board considered the petition.

The board and Dr. Jackson thereafter entered into a Stipulation, by which the board agreed to issue, and Dr. Jackson agreed to accept, a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin. Based on that Stipulation, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Gregory B. Jackson, M.D. (applicant) be, and hereby is, granted a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin imposing the following terms and conditions:


- 1. Applicant shall complete the chemical dependency treatment program at the McBride Center for Impaired Professionals, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and shall not disassociate himself from the program until formally discharged by his supervising physician.
- 2. As a part of his treatment program, applicant shall submit to a program of random witnessed monitoring of his blood or urine for the presence of alcohol and controlled substances on at least a weekly basis.
- 3. As a part of his treatment program, applicant shall participate in a weekly support group facilitated by a counselor and specialist in addiction medicine with ADMC.
- 4. As a part of the program, applicant shall participate in a Doctor's Support Group once a week.

- 5. As a part of the program, applicant shall participate in addiction medicine follow-up with Sheila W. Sorkin, M.D. on an interval basis to be started on a once per month basis.
- 6. As a part of the program, applicant shall participate in follow-up care by a psychiatrist associated with Milwaukee Psychiatric Hospital to coordinate with applicant's current treatment team.
- 7. Applicant shall abstain from any and all personal use of alcohol or controlled substances, as defined by Wis. Stats. sec. 161.01(4), unless prescribed for him by his treating physician.
- 8. Applicant shall attend 12-steps self-help groups a minimum of three times each week.
- 9. During the period of the limited license, applicant shall not apply for or hold a DEA registration.
- 10. Applicant shall be responsible for submission to the board of formal written quarterly reports prepared by his treatment supervisor setting forth applicant's activities and progress in the treatment program, including the results of random drug screens.
- 11. Upon request of the board, applicant shall provide current releases to any affected treatment facilities, complying with federal and state law, authorizing release of all of his medical and treatment records to the board. Copies of said releases shall be filed simultaneously with the board.
- 12. The term of the license shall be for five years from the date hereof. Applicant shall appear before the board at the end of six months and every six months thereafter.
- 13. Violation of the terms and conditions of this order shall result in summary suspension of the license, and shall be deemed as grounds for revocation of the limited license.

STIPULATION

On April 21, 1991, Gregory B. Jackson filed his petition for grant of a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin. On June 20, 1991, and again on July 24, 1991, the board considered the petition.

Based upon the petition, and upon other information of record, the Medical Examining Board (board) agrees to issue, and Gregory B. Jackson, M.D. (Applicant) agrees to accept a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin imposing the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Applicant shall complete the chemical dependency treatment program at the McBride Center for Impaired Professionals, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and shall not disassociate himself from the program until formally discharged by his supervising physician.
- 2. As a part of his treatment program, applicant shall submit to a program of random witnessed monitoring of his blood or urine for the presence of alcohol and controlled substances on at least a weekly basis.
- 3. As a part of his treatment program, applicant shall participate in a weekly support group facilitated by a counselor and specialist in addiction medicine with ADMC.
- 4. As a part of the program, applicant shall participate in a Doctor's Support Group once a week.
- 5. As a part of the program, applicant shall participate in addiction medicine follow-up with Sheila W. Sorkin, M.D. on an interval basis to be started on a once per month basis.

- 6. As a part of the program, applicant shall participate in follow-up care by a psychiatrist associated with Milwaukee Psychiatric Hospital to coordinate with applicant's current treatment team.
- 7. Applicant shall abstain from any and all personal use of alcohol or controlled substances, as defined by Wis. Stats. sec. 161.01(4), unless prescribed for him by his treating physician.
- 8. Applicant shall attend 12-steps self-help groups a minimum of three times each week.
- 9. During the period of the limited license, applicant shall not apply for or hold a DEA registration.
- 10. Applicant shall be responsible for submission to the board of formal written quarterly reports prepared by his treatment supervisor setting forth applicant's activities and progress in the treatment program, including the results of random drug screens.
- 11. Upon request of the board, applicant shall provide current releases to any affected treatment facilities, complying with federal and state law, authorizing release of all of his medical and treatment records to the board. Copies of said releases shall be filed simultaneously with the board.
- 12. The term of the license shall be for five years from the date of the order of the board adopting this Stipulation. Applicant shall appear before the board at the end of six months and every six months thereafter.
- 13. Violation of the terms and conditions of the order of the board adopting this Stipulation shall result in summary suspension of the license, and shall be deemed as grounds for revocation of the limited license.
