NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that

1. The terms of the attached stipulation are approved and accepted by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.

2. Dr. Kaarakka shall not apply for reregistration to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin at any time in the future and shall not practice or attempt to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin when not currently registered.

3. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board closes pending investigative files # 89 MED 355 and #80 MED 677.

It is hereby stipulated between Olli F. Kaarakka, M.D., personally on his own behalf and Steven M. Gloe, Attorney for the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows that:

1. Olli F. Kaarakka, M.D. 1159 North Osborne Boulevard, Racine, WI 53405 is a physician duly licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license # 13510, which was granted on October 26, 1959. Dr. Kaarakka is not currently registered to practice in Wisconsin.

2. Dr. Kaarakka was born on January 1, 1924 and notified the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board on September 25, 1989 that he had retired from the active practice of medicine. Dr. Kaarakka's registration to practice medicine in Wisconsin expired on November 1, 1989.

3. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of pending investigations of Dr. Kaarakka's licensure by the Division of Enforcement (case file #'s 89 MED 355 and MED 677).

4. Dr. Kaarakka understands that by the signing of this Stipulation he voluntarily and knowingly waives his rights, including: the right to a hearing on the allegations against him, at which time the state has the burden of proving those allegations by clear, satisfactory and convincing evidence; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to call witnesses on his behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena; the right to testify himself; the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision; the right to petition for rehearing; and all other applicable rights afforded to him under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, and the Wisconsin Administrative Code.

5. Dr. Kaarakka hereby voluntarily agrees not to apply for reregistration at any time in the future. This agreement is made in light of Dr. Kaarakka's retirement and is not an admission of any allegations which may have been the basis for the pending investigation.

6. Dr. Kaarakka further agrees that he will not practice or attempt to practice medicine or surgery in the state of Wisconsin when not currently registered.

7. Dr. Kaarakka consents to the issuance of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Medical Examining Board, effectuating this stipulation.

8. Upon acceptance of this stipulation, the Medical Examining Board shall close the pending investigations [file #'s 89 MED 355 and 677], and no further action shall be commenced as a result of this investigation.

9. The parties to this stipulation agree that the attorney for the Division of Enforcement may appear before the Medical Examining Board for the purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that the members of the Board may have in connection with their deliberations on the stipulation.

10. The Division of Enforcement joins Dr. Kaarakka in recommending the Medical Examining Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

NOTICE OF APPEAL INFORMATION

(Notice of Rights for Rehearing or Judicial Review,
the times allowed for each and the identification
of the party to be named as respondent)

The following notice is served on you as part of the final decision:

1. Rehearing.

Any person aggrieved by this order may petition for a rehearing within 20 days of the service of this decision, as provided in section 227.49 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is attached. The 20 day period commences the day after personal service or mailing of this decision. (The date of mailing of this decision is shown below.) The petition for rehearing should be filed with the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.

A petition for rehearing is not a prerequisite for appeal directly to circuit court through a petition for judicial review.

2. Judicial Review.

Any person aggrieved by this decision has a right to petition for judicial review of this decision as provided in section 227.53 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is attached. The petition should be filed in circuit court and served upon the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.

within 30 days of service of this decision if there has been no petition for rehearing, or within 30 days of service of the order finally disposing of the petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after the final disposition by operation of law of any petition for rehearing.

The 30 day period commences the day after personal service or mailing of the decision or order, or the day after the final disposition by operation of the law of any petition for rehearing. (The date of mailing of this decision is shown below.) A petition for judicial review should be served upon, and name as the respondent, the following: the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.
