#### ORDER GRANTING LIMITED LICENSE

On March 24, 1992, Dr. Holliman filed his application for a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin. Because Dr. Holliman indicated on his application that he had received inpatient treatment for alcohol abuse, he was asked to appear for oral examination in connection with his application. The board considered the application at its meeting of June 24, 1992.

The board and Doctor Holliman thereafter entered into a Stipulation by which the board agreed to issue, and Dr. Holliman agreed to accept, a limited license to practice medicine and surgery. A copy of the Stipulation is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Based upon the Stipulation and upon other information of record, the Medical Examining Board (board) orders as follows:

#### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Daniel R. Holliman be, and hereby is, granted a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin, imposing the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Applicant shall enroll in the chemical dependency treatment program at the McBride Center for Impaired Professionals, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and shall not disassociate himself from the program until formally discharged by his supervising physician.
- 2. As a part of his treatment program, applicant shall submit to a program of random witnessed monitoring of his blood or urine for the presence of alcohol and controlled substances on at least a weekly basis.

- 3. Applicant shall abstain from any and all personal use of alcohol or controlled substances, as defined by Wis. Stats. sec. 161.01(4), unless prescribed for him by his treating physician.
  - 4. Applicant shall attend A.A. or N.A. meetings a minimum of once each week.
- 5. Applicant shall be responsible for submission to the board of formal written quarterly reports prepared by his treatment supervisor setting forth applicant's activities and progress in the treatment program, including the results of random drug screens.
- 6. Applicant shall provide and keep on file with his supervising physician and all treatment facilities and personnel current releases which comply with all applicable state and federal laws authorizing release of all of his medical and treatment records and reports to the Medical Examining Board and which permit his treating physician and therapists to disclose and discuss the progress of his treatment and rehabilitation with the Medical Examining Board and its agents. Copies of said releases shall be filed simultaneously with the Medical Examining Board.
- 7. The term of the license shall be for one year from the date of this Order. Applicant shall appear before the board after six months for oral interview.
- 8. Violation of the terms and conditions of this Order shall constitute grounds for revocation of the limited license.

#### STIPULATION

On March 24, 1992, Dr. Holliman filed his application for a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin. The board considered the application at its meeting of June 24, 1992.

Based upon the application, and upon other information of record, the Medical Examining Board (board) agrees to issue, and Daniel R. Holliman, M.D. (Applicant) agrees to accept, a limited license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin imposing the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Applicant shall enroll in the chemical dependency treatment program at the McBride Center- for Impaired Professionals, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and shall not disassociate himself from the program until formally discharged by his supervising physician.
- 2. As a part of his treatment program, applicant shall submit to a program of random witnessed monitoring of his blood or urine for the presence of alcohol and controlled substances on at least a weekly basis.
- 3. Applicant shall abstain from any and all personal use of alcohol or controlled substances, as defined by Wis. Stats. sec. 161.01(4), unless prescribed for him by his treating physician.
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quarterly reports prepared by his treatment supervisor setting forth applicant's activities and progress in the treatment program, including the results of random drug screens.

- 6. Applicant shall provide and keep on file with his supervising physician and all treatment facilities and personnel current releases which comply with all applicable state and federal laws authorizing release of all of his medical and treatment records and reports to the Medical Examining Board and which permit his treating physician and therapists to disclose and discuss the progress of his treatment and rehabilitation with the Medical Examining Board and its agents. Copies of said releases shall be filed simultaneously with the Medical Examining Board.
- 7. The term of the license shall be for one year from the date of the order of the board adopting this Stipulation. Applicant shall appear before the board after six months for oral interview.
- 8. Violation of the terms and conditions of the order of the board adopting this Stipulation shall constitute grounds for revocation of the limited license.
