FINDINGS OF FACT

1. James W. Bringe, M.D., Respondent herein, (D.O.B. 7/17/15) is duly licensed and registered to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 9502, which license was first granted on 1/10/46.
2. Respondent's latest address on file with the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 2708 N. 7th Street, Sheboygan, WI 53083.
3. Respondent's specialty area of practice is dermatology.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has authority to enter into this stipulated resolution pursuant to secs. 227.44(5) and 448.02(5), Wis. Stats.


2. That the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to sec. 448.02(3), Wis. Stats.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the voluntary surrender of the license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin of James W. Bringe, M.D., is hereby accepted effective immediately.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if Respondent shall ever reapply for a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin that Respondent shall take and pass all tests then required for original licensure as a physician in Wisconsin.



It is hereby stipulated and agreed, by and between, James W. Bringe, M.D., Respondent; Raymond Porter, attorney for Respondent; and, John R. Zwieg, attorney for the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows:


1. Respondent is aware of his right to seek legal representation prior to signing this stipulation, and has done so.
2. Respondent agrees to voluntarily surrender his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin.
3. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Medical Examining Board. The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
4. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings. In the event that this Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
5. The parties to this stipulation agree that the Respondent, his attorney, and the attorney for the Division of Enforcement may appear before the Board for the purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that the members of the Board may have in connection with their deliberations on the stipulation.

6. The parties to this stipulation agree that the member of the Board appointed as the investigative advisor in this matter may appear before the Board in open or closed session for the purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that the members of the Board may have in connection with their deliberations on the stipulation.

NOTICE OF APPEAL INFORMATION

(Notice of Rights for Rehearing or Judicial Review,
the times allowed for each, and the identification
of the party to be named as respondent)

The following notice is served on you as part of the final decision:

1. Rehearing.

Any person aggrieved by this order may petition for a rehearing within 20 days of the service of this decision, as provided in section 227.49 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is attached. The 20 day period commences the day after personal service or mailing of this decision. (The date of mailing of this decision is shown below.) The petition for rehearing should be filed with the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.

A petition for rehearing is not a prerequisite for appeal directly to circuit court through a petition for judicial review.

2. Judicial Review.

Any person aggrieved by this decision has a right to petition for judicial review of this decision as provided in section 227.53 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is attached. The petition should be filed in circuit court and served upon the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board

within 30 days of service of this decision if there has been no petition for rehearing, or within 30 days of service of the order finally disposing of the petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after the final disposition by operation of law of any petition for rehearing.

The 30 day period commences the day after personal service or mailing of the decision or order, or the day after the final disposition by operation of the law of any petition for rehearing. (The date of mailing of this decision is shown below.) A petition for judicial review should be served upon, and name as the respondent, the following: the State of Wisconsin Medical Examining Board.
