The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Robert J. Blaschke (D.O.B. 06/27/48) is duly licensed as a funeral director in the state of Wisconsin (license #3952).
- 2. Mr. Blaschke's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Funeral Directors Examining Board is 1007 Caledonia Street, La Crosse, WI 54602.
- 3. On December 31, 1989, Mr. Blaschke's Wisconsin funeral directing registration expired, and Mr. Blaschke did not attempt to renew his registration until September 13, 1995. During that period of time, Mr. Blaschke continued his work as a funeral director with Nelson Funeral Home and Blaschke Funeral Home in La Crosse, Wisconsin.
- 4. In resolution of this matter, Mr. Blaschke consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

By the conduct described above, Robert J. Blaschke is subject to disciplinary action against his license to practice as a funeral director in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stats. §§445.04(2), 445.12(5) and 445.13(1); and Wis. Adm. Code §§FD2.03 and 3.02(1) and (2).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1) The license of Robert J. Blaschke (#3952) shall be suspended for a period of thirty (30) days. This suspension shall commence upon the date that the Respondent is granted current registration.
- 2) Within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, the Respondent shall submit a plan acceptable to the Board for handling and processing Respondent's office correspondence.
- 3) Within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, the Respondent shall pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars. Payment shall be made via certified check or money order payable to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing.

STIPULATION 95 FDR 022

RESPONDENT :

It is hereby stipulated between Robert J. Blaschke, personally on his own behalf and Steven M. Gloe, Attorney for the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows that:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation of Mr. Blaschke's licensure by the Division of Enforcement. Mr. Blaschke consents to the resolution of this investigation by stipulation and without the issuance of a formal complaint.
- 2. Mr. Blaschke understands that by the signing of this Stipulation he voluntarily and knowingly waives his rights, including: the right to a hearing on the allegations against him, at which time the state has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to call witnesses on his behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena; the right to testify himself; the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision; the right to petition for rehearing; and all other applicable rights afforded to him under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, and the Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- 3. Mr. Blaschke is aware of his right to seek legal representation and has been provided the opportunity to seek legal advice prior to signing this stipulation.
- 4. Mr. Blaschke agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Funeral Directors Examining Board. The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings. In the event that this Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
- 6. The parties to this stipulation agree that the attorney for the Division of Enforcement and the member of the Funeral Directors Examining Board assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the

Board for the purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that the members of the Board may have in connection with their deliberations on the stipulation.

7. The Division of Enforcement joins Mr. Blaschke in recommending that the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

1. REHEARING

Any person aggrieved by this order may file a written petition for rehearing within 20 days after service of this order, as provided in sec. 227.49 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is reprinted on side two of this sheet. The 20 day period commences the day of personal service or mailing of this decision. (The date of mailing this decision is shown above.)

A petition for rehearing should name as respondent and be filed with the party identified in the box above.

A petition for rehearing is not a prerequisite for appeal or review.

2. JUDICIAL REVIEW.

Any person aggrieved by this decision may petition for judicial review as specified in sec. 227.53, Wisconsin Statutes a copy of which is reprinted on side two of this sheet. By law, a petition for review must be filed in circuit court and should name as the respondent the party listed in the box above. A copy of the petition for judicial review should be served upon the party listed in the box above.

A petition must be filed within 30 days after service of this decision if there is no petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after service of the order finally disposing of a petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after the final disposition by operation of law of any petition for rehearing.

The 30-day period for serving and filing a petition commences on the day after personal service or mailing of the decision by the agency, or the day after the final disposition by operation of the law of any petition for rehearing. (The date of mailing this decision is shown above.)
