The Executive Committee having received the results of the investigation into the alleged misconduct of Roderic J. Senn and in conformity with its rules now makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Leona Nesmith was a patient of Mr. Senn's at Lutheran Social Services from February 19, 1994 through April 13, 1994 when she was transferred to Cynthia McMillan.
2. Mr. Senn stipulates in his written response and in his interview with Fred Harvey that he was involved in a sexual relationship with Ms. Nesmith beginning in May 1994 and terminating in April of 1995.
3. Mr. Senn was terminated from his job at Lutheran Social Services for his conduct with Ms. Nesmith.
4. Five letters of support and recommendations for leniency were received and reviewed by the Executive Committee.

CONCLUSION

Roderic J. Senn has violated the Code of Conduct, Section A. 1. (b):


A counselor shall not have a sexual relationship with a client at any stage in the client's treatment process, nor for one year following discharge from all elements of the treatment continuum.

DECISION

The certification of Roderic J. Senn is hereby revoked.
