PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT the State of Wisconsin Board of Nursing, having reviewed the petition for extension of stay and having reviewed the contents of the file in this matter, hereby denies the petition for the following reasons:


On or about June 8, 1995, Ms. Garbade forged a drug screening witness sheet in conjunction with the monitoring required as a part of her continued licensure.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the petition of Jayne A. Garbade for the extension of stay is hereby denied and the license of Ms. Garbade is hereby suspended effective as of the date of this Order.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT under the provisions of the Board order dated November 5, 1993, you have a right to a hearing on the denial of your petition for the extension of stay if you file a request for hearing in accordance with the provisions of Chapter RL 1, Wis. Adm. Code. You may request a hearing within thirty (30) days after the mailing of this notice of denial. Your request must contain your name and address, the type of license for which you have applied, the reasons why you are requesting a hearing, the facts which you intend to prove at the hearing, and a description of the mistake, if any, you believe was made. Within twenty (20) days of receipt of a request for hearing, the board shall grant or deny the request. You will be notified in writing of the board's decision. The filing of a request for hearing on the denial does not act to stay the suspension of your license.
