ORDER GRANTING PETITION

The Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter on February 23, 1994. By the terms of the board's Order, Dr. Frederick's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended for at least five years, with provision for consecutive three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance by Dr. Frederick with certain limitations on the license, including participation in a treatment and rehabilitation program and a drug screening program.

On July 4, 1994, the board terminated the stay of suspension based upon findings that Dr. Frederick had failed to submit evidence of compliance with the terms and conditions of his limited license, and had failed to request any further stay of the license as required by the board's Final Decision and Order.

On August 30, 1994, the board issued its Order Granting Stay, granting further three month stays of the suspension of Dr. Frederick's license conditioned upon his compliance with the terms and conditions of the board's February 23, 1994, Final Decision and Order.

On January 23, 1995, the board again received information of violation of the terms and conditions of the board's Final Decision and Order. The matter came before the Board on a Motion to Terminate Stay filed by the Division of Enforcement, Department of Regulation and Licensing. Notice of the proceeding was given to respondent. Attorney Arthur Thexton appeared before the board on February 22, 1995, in support of the Motion. Dr. Frederick did not appear, but sent a letter to the Board acknowledging his knowledge of the proceeding. The board issued its Order Denying Petition on March 3, 1995.

By his letter dated May 2, 1995, Dr. Frederick petitioned the board for a renewal of the stay of the suspension of his license, and he appeared before the board on May 25, 1995, in support of his petition. The board denied the petition by its Order dated June 5, 1995.

Dr. Frederick next petitioned the board for a stay of the suspension of his license by letter dated July 3, 1995, and he appeared before the board in support of his petition on July 27, 1995. The board considered the matter on that date, and denied the petition by its order dated August 3, 1995.

By letter dated March 1, 1996, Dr. Frederick again petitioned for a stay of the suspension of his license, and he appeared before the board on March 20, 1996, in support of the petition. The board considered the matter on that date, and again denied the stay.

Dr. Frederick next appeared before the board in support of reinstatement of the stay on August 22, 1996. The petition was supported by Dr. Frederick's therapist, Charles J. Engel, M.D. The board considered the matter on that date.

Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Thomas B. Frederick, M.D., as ordered by the board's Final Decision and Order in this matter dated February 23, 1994, shall be stayed for a period of three months, conditioned upon compliance with the conditions and limitations outlined in paragraph 2 of the February 23, 1994, Order, captioned "Conditions of Stay and Limitations."

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Dr. Frederick may apply for consecutive three month stays of the suspension which shall be granted upon demonstration of continuing compliance with the conditions and limitations set forth in paragraph 2. of the February 23, 1994, Order, captioned "Conditions of Stay and Limitations."

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon compliance for a period of five years from the date hereof with the conditions and limitations set forth on the board's February 23, 1994, Order, Dr. Frederick may petition for return to full unlimited licensure status.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that paragraphs 4. through 8. of the board's February 23, 1994 Order shall remain in full force and effect.
