The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent, Norman J. Sass, is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a funeral director licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license #3686, originally granted on February 20, 1964.
- 2. Respondent, Joseph E. Sass Funeral Home, is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a funeral home licensed in the State of Wisconsin.
- 3. In approximately 1987, 1988 and 1989, the Respondents engaged in certain activities related to the sale of PNS, Inc., pre-need insurance to fund funeral arrangements in violation of applicable administrative rules and statutes.
- 4. Any violations of the applicable administrative rules and statutes by the Respondents were unintentional.
- 5. The Respondents ceased their involvement in activities related to the sale of such preneed insurance in 1989.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 6. The Funeral Directors Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to §445.13(1) and §445.105(4), Wis. Stats., and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to §227.44(5), Wis. Stats.
- 7. The activities described in paragraph 3, above, violated provisions of Chapter 445, Wis. Stats. and Chapter FDE 3, Wis. Adm. Code.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the attached Stipulation is accepted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that this disciplinary proceeding shall be and hereby is resolved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that no discipline is imposed against the Respondents as a result of this proceeding. The accepted principles of professional discipline do not require the imposition of discipline against the Respondents in the present case. The Respondents' violations were unintentional and the activity in question ceased in 1989.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that respondents shall pay COSTS in this matter in the TOTAL amount of \$750.00, within 30 days of the date of this order.

STIPULATION

It is hereby stipulated between the above Respondents, John E. Talsky, attorney for Respondents and Michael J. Berndt, attorney for the Division of Enforcement of the Department of Regulation and Licensing, as follows:

- 1. In resolution of these proceedings, the Respondents consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondents waive all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 2. The Respondents have read the attached Final Decision and Order with their attorney and understand it. The Respondents understand that by signing this stipulation they consent to the attached Final Decision and Order being the complete resolution of all claims arising out of case 90 FDR 015 between the Respondents, the Division of Enforcement of the Department of Regulation and Licensing and the Funeral Directors Examining Board.
- 3. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation or the proposed Final Decision and Order, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings. In the event that this Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
- 4. The parties agree that an attorney for the Division of Enforcement may appear before the Board, in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondents or Respondents' attorney, for the purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that the members of the Board and its staff may have in connection with their deliberations on the case.
- 5. The Board Advisors in this matter may participate freely in any deliberations of the Board regarding acceptance of this Stipulation and the proposed Final Decision and Order, may relate to the Board any knowledge and views of the case acquired during the investigation, and may vote on the ultimate acceptance or rejection by the Board of this agreement.
- 6. Respondents agree to honor all pre-need insurance plans for their customers related to PNS, Inc., and have done so to date.
- 7. The Division of Enforcement joins Respondents in recommending that the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 8. Respondents are informed that should the Board adopt this stipulation, the board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in the monthly *Report of Decisions*

1. REHEARING

Any person aggrieved by this order may file a written petition for rehearing within 20 days after service of this order, as provided in sec. 227.49 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is reprinted on side two of this sheet. The 20 day period commences the day of personal service or mailing of this decision. (The date of mailing this decision is shown above.)

A petition for rehearing should name as respondent and be filed with the party identified in the box above.

A petition for rehearing is not a prerequisite for appeal or review.

2. JUDICIAL REVIEW.

Any person aggrieved by this decision may petition for judicial review as specified in sec. 227.53, Wisconsin Statutes a copy of which is reprinted on side two of this sheet. By law, a petition for review must be filed in circuit court and should name as the respondent the party listed in the box above. A copy of the petition for judicial review should be served upon the party listed in the box above.

A pention must be filed within 30 days after service of this decision if there is no

A petition must be filed within 30 days after service of this decision if there is no petition for reheating, or within 30 days after service of the order finally disposing of a petition for reheating, or within 30 days after the final disposition by operation of law of any petition for reheating.
