

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Scott E. Russell (DOB 04/24/59), 4520 Choctaw Trail, Green Bay, WI 54313, is duly licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a barbering and cosmetology manager, license # 15662.
- 2 City Looks, 2783 South Oneida Street, Green Bay, WI 54304 is duly licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a barbering and cosmetology establishment, license # 21025. This establishment license was granted on August 16, 1990.



- 3. On exact dates unknown, but for a period of three years, ending on May 30, 1995, Mr. Russell operated the establishment referred to in \$\Pi^2\$, above, with an unlicensed person, Gretchen Schenk, on staff.
- 4. During the period of time referred to in ¶3, above, Mr. Russell was the sole owner of City Looks. As owner, Mr. Russell was and is responsible for compliance with licensure laws and regulations concerning the operation of his establishment.
- 5. In resolution of this matter, Mr. Russell consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Scott E. Russell, by the conduct referred to in ¶¶2 through 4, above, has violated § 454.04 (1) (a) Wis. Statutes, aided and abetted unlicensed practice; Wis. Admin. Code § BC 2.04(1), assisted in the unauthorized practice of barbering and cosmetology; and violated § BC 2.07 (2) (b) Wis. Admin. Code, as manager, failed to insure that the establishment was in compliance with chapter 454, Statutes.

<u>ORDER</u>

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Scott E. Russell shall pay to the Department of Regulation and Licensing a forfeiture of THREE THOUSAND dollars (\$3,000.00). Payment shall be submitted no later than sixty (60) days from the date of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the event Respondent Scott E. Russell fails to timely submit payment of the forfeiture as set forth above, his manager license and the establishment license of City Looks, 2783 South Oneida Street, Green Bay, WI 54304 SHALL BE SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Mr. Russell has complied with the terms of this order.

This order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.

STIPULATION 95 BAC 025

SCOTT E. RUSSELL, d/b/a/ CITY LOOKS RESPONDENT.

It is hereby stipulated between Scott E. Russell, personally on his own behalf and on behalf of City Looks; and Henry E. Sanders, Attorney for the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows that:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Enforcement (95 BAC 025). Mr. Russell consents to the resolution of this investigation by stipulation and without the issuance of a formal complaint.
- 2. Mr. Russell understands that by the signing of this Stipulation he voluntarily and knowingly waives his rights, including: the right to a hearing on the allegations against him, at which time the state has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to call witnesses on his behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena; the right to testify himself; the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision; the right to petition for rehearing; and all other applicable rights afforded to him under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- 3. Mr. Russell is aware of his right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal advice prior to signing this Stipulation.
- 4. Mr. Russell agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Barbering and Cosmetology Examining Board. The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the attached order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 5, If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings. In the event that this Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree to contend that the Board had not been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney for the Division of Enforcement and the member of the Barbering and Cosmetology Board assigned as advisor in

this investigation may appear before the Board for the purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that the Board may have in connection with their deliberations on the Stipulation.

7. The Division of Enforcement joins Mr. Russell in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

1. REHEARING

Any person aggrieved by this order may file a written petition for rehearing within 20 days after service of this order, as provided in sec. 227.49 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a copy of which is reprinted on side two of this sheet. The 20 day period commences the day of personal service or mailing of this decision. (The date of mailing this decision is shown above.)

A petition for rehearing should name as respondent and be filed with the party identified in the box above.

A petition for rehearing is not a prerequisite for appeal or review.

2. JUDICIAL REVIEW.

Any person aggrieved by this decision may petition for judicial review as specified in sec. 227.53, Wisconsin Statutes a copy of which is reprinted on side two of this sheet. By law, a petition for review must be filled in circuit court and should name as the respondent the party listed in the box above. A copy of the petition for judicial review should be served upon the party listed in the box above.

A petition must be filed within 30 days after service of this decision if there is no petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after service of the order finally disposing of a petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after the final disposition by operation of law of any petition for rehearing.

The 30-day period for serving and filing a petition commences on the day after personal service or mailing of the decision by the agency, or the day after the final disposition by operation of the law of any petition for rehearing. (The date of mailing this decision is shown above.)
