The Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board received a Stipulation submitted by the parties to the above-captioned matter. The Stipulation, a copy of which is attached hereto, was executed by Richard J. Schulte, D.D.S., personally, and by Gilbert C. Lubcke, attorney for the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement. Based upon the Stipulation of the parties, the Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Richard J. Schulte, D.D.S., 1707 North Prospect Avenue, Unit 15A, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 53202, was born on 2/5/33 and has been licensed to practice dentistry in the state of

Wisconsin since 7/2/56, license #1304. Dr. Schulte's license to practice dentistry in the state of Wisconsin expired on 9/30/97.

2. Dr. Schulte retired from the practice of dentistry in Wisconsin in September, 1995 as the result of a medical disability.
3. An investigation, 97 DEN 135, is pending before the Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board. The allegations which are the bases for the investigation are that Dr. Schulte failed to make timely diagnoses and provide treatment of two dental caries. As a result of the delay in diagnosis and treatment, the patient allegedly required root canals in these teeth.
4. Dr. Schulte, in consideration of his retirement from the practice of dentistry, agrees to surrender all of his rights and privileges to practice dentistry in the state of Wisconsin, including the right to renew his license to practice dentistry, and agrees that he will not renew or attempt to renew his license to practice dentistry at any time in the future.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board has jurisdiction in this proceeding pursuant to sec. 447.07, Stats.
2. The Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board has the authority to resolve this proceeding by stipulation without an evidentiary hearing pursuant to sec. 227.44(5), Stats.

#### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Stipulation of the parties is approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Richard J. Schulte, D.D.S. will not renew or attempt to renew his license to practice dentistry in the state of Wisconsin at any time in the future.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Richard J. Schulte, D.D.S. will not practice or attempt to practice dentistry in the state of Wisconsin on or after the date of this Final Decision And Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the pending investigation, 97 DEN 135, will be and hereby is closed without further proceedings.

The rights of a party aggrieved by this Final Decision And Order to petition the Wisconsin

Dentistry Examining Board for rehearing and to petition for judicial review are set forth in the attached "Notice of Appeal Information".

It is hereby stipulated between Richard J. Schulte, D.D.S., personally, and Gilbert C. Lubcke, attorney for the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows:

1. Richard J. Schulte, D.D.S., 1707 North Prospect Avenue, Unit 15A, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53202, was born on 2/5/33 and has been licensed to practice dentistry since 7/2/56, license #1304. Dr. Schulte's license to practice dentistry in the state of Wisconsin expired on 9/30/97.
2. Dr. Schulte retired from the practice of dentistry in Wisconsin in September, 1995 as the result of a medical disability.
3. An investigation of Dr. Schulte is pending before the Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board, investigative file 97 DEN 135. This Stipulation fully resolves all of the allegations arising out of investigative file 97 DEN 135.
4. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the Dentistry Examining Board may render the Final Decision And Order attached hereto, the terms of which have been agreed upon by the parties.
5. The parties waive all costs of this proceeding.
6. Dr. Schulte understands that by signing this Stipulation, he freely, voluntarily and knowingly waives his rights, including the right to be represented by an attorney, the right to a hearing on the allegations against him, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses against him, the right to call witnesses on his behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena, the right to testify on his own behalf, the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the Final Decision and Order, the right to petition for rehearing, the right to judicial review, and all other applicable rights afforded to him under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code.

7. This Stipulation is subject to the approval of the Case Advisor, Bruce Barrett, D.D.S., and acceptance by the Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board.


8. The parties to this Stipulation and the Case Advisor, Bruce Barrett, D.D.S., may appear before the Dentistry Examining Board in support of this Stipulation. Any appearance by either party pursuant to this paragraph shall be preceded by proper and timely notice to all parties to this proceeding.

9. If any term of this Stipulation or the incorporated Final Decision And Order is not accepted by the Case Advisor and the Dentistry Examining Board, then no term of this Stipulation or the Final Decision And Order will be binding in any manner on any party, and the matter will be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings.



## NOTICE OF RIGHTS OF APPEAL

TO: RICHARD J SCHULTE DDS

You have been issued a Final Decision and Order. For purposes of service the date of mailing of this Final Decision and Order is 5/8/98. Your rights to request a rehearing and/or judicial review are summarized below and set forth fully in the statutes reprinted on the reverse side.

### A. REHEARING.

Any person aggrieved by this order may file a written petition for rehearing within 20 days after service of this order, as provided in section 227.49 of the Wisconsin Statutes. The 20 day period commences on the day of personal service or the date of mailing of this decision. The date of mailing of this Final Decision is shown above.

A petition for rehearing should name as respondent and be filed with the party identified below.

A petition for rehearing shall specify in detail the grounds for relief sought and supporting authorities. Rehearing will be granted only on the basis of some material error of law, material error of fact, or new evidence sufficiently strong to reverse or modify the Order which could not have been previously discovered by due diligence. The agency may order a rehearing or enter an order disposing of the petition without a hearing. If the agency does not enter an order disposing of the petition within 30 days of the filing of the petition, the petition shall be deemed to have been denied at the end of the 30 day period.

A petition for rehearing is not a prerequisite for judicial review.

### B. JUDICIAL REVIEW.

Any person aggrieved by this decision may petition for judicial review as specified in section 227.53, Wisconsin Statutes (copy on reverse side). The petition for judicial review must be filed in circuit court where the petitioner resides, except if the petitioner is a non-resident of the state, the proceedings shall be in the circuit court for Dane County. The petition should name as the respondent the Department, Board, Examining Board, or Affiliated Credentialing Board which issued the Final Decision and Order. A copy of the petition for judicial review must also be served upon the respondent at the address listed below.

A petition for judicial review must be served personally or by certified mail on the respondent and filed with the court within 30 days after service of the Final Decision and Order if there is no petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after service of the order finally disposing of a petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after the final disposition by operation of law of any petition for rehearing. Courts have held that the right to judicial review of administrative agency decisions is dependent upon strict compliance with the requirements of sec. 227.53 (1) (a), Stats. This statute requires, among other things, that a petition for review be served upon the agency and be filed with the clerk of the circuit court within the applicable thirty day period.

The 30 day period for serving and filing a petition for judicial review commences on the day after personal service or mailing of the Final Decision and Order by the agency, or, if a petition for rehearing has been timely filed, the day after personal service or mailing of a final decision or disposition by the agency of the petition for rehearing, or the day after the final disposition by operation of the law of a petition for rehearing. The date of mailing of this Final Decision and Order is shown above.

The petition shall state the nature of the petitioner's interest, the facts showing that the petitioner is a person aggrieved by the decision, and the grounds specified in section 227.57, Wisconsin Statutes, upon which the petitioner contends that the decision should be reversed or modified. The petition shall be entitled in the name of the person serving it as Petitioner and the Respondent as described below.
