On September 17, 1994, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board issued an Order Reinstating and Limiting License in the above-captioned matter. Among the terms and conditions set forth in the board's order was that Mr. Collins obtain random, witnessed screens for the presence of all controlled substances and alcohol. Under the Order, Mr. Collins is currently required to obtain four screens every month.

Mr. Collins requests that that the number of required screens be reduced from four per month to twice a month. Supporting correspondence from Mr. Collins' treatment facility has also been received.

As Mr. Collins has successfully completed four years of the five year program required under the board's Order, the board is of the opinion that the requested reduction in the monthly drug screen requirement is appropriate and should be granted.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the requirement that Mr. Collins participate in random, witnessed collection of urine and/or blood specimens for monitoring for the presence of all controlled substances, including in particular but not limited to Tetrahydrocannabinols, and alcohol in his blood and/or urine at least four (4) times per month, is reduced to two (2) times per month.
