On February 13, 1996, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board issued a *Final Decision and Order* in the above-captioned matter. Among the terms and conditions set forth in the board's order was that Mr. Kujawa could not be employed nor work in the capacity of a "pharmacist-in-charge", as defined in Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and that his pharmacy practice must be performed in the presence of another pharmacist. Subsequently, the board modified the restriction to permit 8 hours of unsupervised practice, but with no more than 4 of those hours to be consecutive.

Mr. Kujawa has requested that his practice supervision requirement be modified to permit him to practice without supervision of another pharmacist for 12 hours each week, and without regard to when those hours might be spent. His request was supported by his employer and treatment facility. The record indicates that the progress of Mr. Kujawa in treatment has been such as to permit him to practice as a pharmacist-in-charge as requested.

Mr. Kujawa also requested that his therapy requirement be reduced. However, in light of the recent authorizing of unsupervised pharmacy practice, as added to in this order, the board believes that the current therapy schedule should remain in effect for now.

Based upon the foregoing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Gregory J. Kujawa, R.Ph., may act as a pharmacist-in-charge within the meaning of section Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and thereby perform professional pharmacy services without the continuous presence and supervision of another licensed pharmacist for a maximum of twelve (12) hours per week.

FURTHERMORE, IT IS ORDERED that the authorization for Gregory J. Kujawa, R.Ph., to act as a pharmacist-in-charge is limited to the performance of such pharmacy services at, and while in the employ of, Value Center Pharmacies, Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

FURTHERMORE, IT IS ORDERED that in all other respects, the previous orders of the board in this matter remain in full force and effect.
