ORDER

On May 5, 1995, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period until further notice of the board.

By letter received by the board on April 1, 1999, Ms. Lange requested information on what would be required to have her license reinstated. By letter dated May 24, 1999, the department monitor requested additional information and reports relating to any treatment Ms. Lange has undergone since the suspension of her license. In response, Ms. Lange submitted a letter from a person attesting to Ms. Lange's attendance at AA, and a June 10, 1999 letter from Ms. Lange's physician, William N. Watson, M.D., recounting Ms. Lange's treatment between March, 1997 and December, 1998, for Recurrent Major Depressive Disorder. Dr. Watson indicates in his letter that he is not aware of Ms. Lange's current status, but that the prognosis for Ms. Lange's condition with adequate treatment is generally good.

Based upon the foregoing, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that upon submission by Ms. Lange of a current assessment by a therapist satisfactory to the board establishing that Ms. Lange is competent to safely resume the practice of nursing, and recommending conditions, if any, which should be imposed upon her practice, the board will further consider Ms. Lange's petition for reinstatement of her license.
