ORDER EXTENDING DEADLINE

By its Final Decision and Order dated March 26, 1998, the Medical Examining Board limited respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin to require that he take and satisfactorily pass a 45 hour course entitled Proper Prescribing of Controlled Dangerous Substances, sponsored by Forensic and Educational Consultants of Margate, NJ., and that he complete an educational program in medical recordkeeping to be designed and conducted by the University of Wisconsin Continuing Medical Education Program. The deadline for the second program was March 26, 1999.

On May 19, 1999, the board was notified that the Wisconsin Continuing Medical Education Program had failed to conduct the program by the established deadline through no fault of Dr. Bolek. Accordingly, the deadline for completion of the educational program in medical recordkeeping to be designed and conducted by the University of Wisconsin Continuing Medical Education Program was extended to June 15, 1999.

On August 25, the board considered a request by George Mejicano, Director of the U.W. Medical School Office of Continuing Medical Education, to extend the deadline for completing the program until January 1, 2000, in order to permit the program to at that time to monitor Dr. Bolek's continuing compliance with proper recordkeeping principles and procedures. Based upon that request, it is ordered as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the deadline for completion of the educational program in medical recordkeeping to be designed and conducted by the University of Wisconsin Continuing Medical Education Program is hereby extended to January 1, 2000.
