On August 12, 1998, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board issued a *Final Decision of Order* in the above-captioned matter. Among the terms and conditions were that Mr. Moon could not be employed nor work in the capacity of a "pharmacist in charge", as defined in Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and that he participate in individual and/or group therapy sessions at least once a week.

Mr. Moon has requested that he be permitted act as pharmacist in charge for one hour daily in order to cover lunches, as well as on one weekend per month. He has also requested that his therapy sessions be reduced to twice a month. On January 9, 1999, the board considered the requests of Mr. Moon. The board granted the request to reduce therapy sessions to twice a month. The board also granted the request to work unsupervised for one hour each day, but did not grant the request respecting working one weekend a month unsupervised.

Based upon the foregoing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Craig W. Moon, R.Ph. may act as a pharmacist in charge within the meaning of section Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and thereby perform professional pharmacy services without the continuous presence and supervision of another licensed pharmacist for a maximum of one hour per day.

FURTHERMORE, IT IS ORDERED that the requirement that Mr. Moon participate in individual and/or group therapy sessions not less than once weekly, is reduced to requiring such participation not less than twice monthly.

FURTHERMORE, IT IS ORDERED that in all other respects, the previous orders of the board in this matter remain in full force and effect.
