On November 19, 1998, February 24, 1999, and, July 22, 1999, the board considered Dr. Galva further three month stays of the suspension of his license, and granted the stays by its Orders 27, 1998, March 5, 1999 and July 27, 1999.	
On November 19, 1999, the board considered Dr. Galvani's request for a further three mosuspension of his license. Based on that request, and upon all other information of record horders as follows:
