MODIFICATION OF ORDER
(November 1999)

To: James A. Meyer, R.Ph.

On November 10, 1998, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board issued a *Final Decision and Order* in the above-captioned matter. Among the terms and conditions were that Mr. Meyer could not be employed nor work in the capacity of a "pharmacist in charge", as defined in Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code.

Mr. Meyer has requested that he be permitted to act as pharmacist in charge for 20 hours per week. The board's approach historically has been to permit a gradual increase in the number of unsupervised practice hours as a licensee's recovery progresses. In this case, the board determined that Mr. Meyer should be granted 4 hours per week of unsupervised practice, with the condition that he not be permitted to open or close the pharmacy.

Based upon the foregoing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that James A. Meyer, R.Ph. may act as a pharmacist in charge within the meaning of section Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and thereby perform professional pharmacy services without the continuous presence and supervision of another licensed pharmacist for a maximum of four (4) hours per week, provided that he may neither open nor close the pharmacy.

FURTHERMORE, IT IS ORDERED that in all other respects, the previous orders of the board in this matter remain in full force and effect.
