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ORDER IMPOSING SUSPENSION

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On October 30, 1992, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period of time, with provision for successive three month stays of the suspension, conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency and that she refrain from the use of alcohol and unprescribed controlled substances.

On September 10, 1992, the board received notification from respondent's treatment program that respondent had relapsed on two occasions and had received an OWI citation. Based upon that violation of the board's Order, the board terminated the stay of the suspension of Ms. Gengler's license and suspended the license, effective January 24, 1993.

By letter dated February 28, 1997, Ms. Gengler petitioned the board to reinstate the stay of suspension of her license. She subsequently provided the board with documentation of her progress in her recovery. The board considered the petition at its meeting of May 2, 1997, and granted the stay by its Order dated May 9, 1997.

By letter dated January 5, 1998, Ms. Gengler requested that the requirement that she participate in therapy be terminated. The board considered the request at its meeting of January 30, 1998, and granted the request by its Order dated February 10, 1998.

By letter dated May 29, 1998, Ms. Gengler requested that all limitations on her license be terminated. The board denied the request by its Order dated July 18, 1998.

On January 29, 1999, the board considered evidence that Ms. Gengler had violated the terms of her limited license by appearing at her place of employment on October 25, 1998, while under the influence of alcohol.

Based upon probable cause to believe that Ms. Gengler has violated the terms of her limited license, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the stay of the suspension of the license of Julie A. Gengler to practice as a licensed practical nurse is terminated, and Ms. Gengler's license is hereby suspended.
