ORDER IMPOSING DEADLINE
On March 27, 1996, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By its Order, the board limited Dr. Feitelberg's license to require that he satisfactorily complete by July 11, 1998, an educational program directed at the diagnosis and treatment of peripheral vascular disease, the diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases of the foot, and current antibiotic therapy.
By letter dated January 29, 1999, the Podiatrists Affiliated Credentialing Board, successor to the Medical examining Board in the regulation of licensed podiatrists, extended the time for completing the program to March 15, 1999, and ordered Dr. Feitelberg to appear before the board for oral examination and to demonstrate satisfactory completion of the program. In complying with the new schedule, Dr. Feitelberg was to appear at the U.W. School of Medicine Office of Continuing Education on March 15, 1999. He failed to do so.
Dr. Feitelberg appeared before the Podiatrists Affiliated Credentialing Board on March 22, 1999, to explain his failure to comply with the amended schedule of completion of the educational program. Based upon that appearance and other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:
<u>ORDER</u>
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Dr. Feitelberg shall appear before the Podiatrists Affiliated Credentialing Board on May 17, 1999, for an oral examination and to demonstrate compliance with the Final Decision and Order in this matter dated March 27, 1996. By that time, Dr. Feitelberg shall have completed his obligations under the Final decision and Order, including the Problem Oriented Medical Records Course, the Infectious Disease Home Study Course, and all required assessments.
