The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed the Stipulation and considers it acceptable. Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Margaret E. Slogaski (D.O.B. 3/13/38) is duly licensed as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin (lic # 3941). This license was first granted on July 3, 1961.
2. Respondent’s most recent address on file with the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 1421 South 36th Street, Milwaukee, WI 53215.
3. On 3/27/98, Respondent reported for work at the Milwaukee Protestant Home while intoxicated. A test revealed a blood alcohol level of 0.28. Respondent’s employment was terminated.
4. An AODA assessment of Respondent conducted on September 16, 1998, by United Behavioral Health, Inc. resulted in a diagnosis of ETOH dependence and depression.
5. As a result of a medical condition Respondent is no longer seeking employment as a nurse and tenders the voluntary surrender of her license.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

By the conduct described above, Margaret E. Slogaski is subject to disciplinary action against her license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 441.07(1)(c) and (d) and Wis. Adm. Code sec. N 7.04(1) and (15).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The stipulation of the parties is accepted.
2. The VOLUNTARY SURRENDER by Margaret E. Slogaski of her license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin is accepted.
3. In the event Respondent shall ever re-apply for a license to practice as a nurse in the state of Wisconsin, she shall, in addition to all other requirements for licensure, demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board of Nursing that she does not have a chemical

dependence, and that she can safely and reliably perform nursing functions.

4. This Order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.
