The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed the Stipulation and considers it acceptable. Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Bonnie J. Olstinske (D.O.B. 10/30/56) is duly licensed as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin (lic # 18356). This license was first granted on December 10, 1976.
- 2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 2117 Carlisle Avenue, Racine, WI 53407.
- 3. On January 11, 1996, a nursing home pre-employment drug screen of Respondent tested positive for cocaine.
- 4. On July 30, 1996, Respondent was convicted in the Racine County Circuit Court in case 96CM653 of theft of personal property.
- 5. On July 30, 1997, Respondent was convicted in the Racine County Circuit Court in case 96CF253 of theft of an automobile.
- 6. On November 3, 1998, Respondent was convicted in the Racine County Circuit Court in case 98CT982 of OWI, second offense.
- 7. A condition of sentencing in the three criminal cases mentioned above was abstinance from alcohol and other drugs and successful participation in an AODA treatment program. However, on February 3, 1999, Respondent

tested positive for the presence of cocaine in her urine. Respondent's probation is being revoked and she is awaiting sentencing in the Racine County Jail.

8. Respondent tenders the voluntary revocation of her license to practice as a nurse in the state of Wisconsin.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

By the conduct described above, Bonnie J. Olstinske is subject to disciplinary action against her license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 441.07(1)(b), (c) and (d), 941.30(1) and 948.21(1), and Wis. Adm. Code sec. N 7.04(1), (2) and (15).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. The stipulation of the parties is accepted.
- 2. The license of Bonnie J. Olstinske to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin is REVOKED.
- 3. In the event Respondent shall ever re-apply for a license to practice as a nurse in the state of Wisconsin, she shall, in addition to all other requirements for licensure, demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board of Nursing that she does not have a chemical dependence and that she can safely and reliably perform nursing functions.
- 4. This Order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.
