The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Pamela L. Buggs (D.O.B. 05/29/52) is duly licensed as a practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin (license #23307). This license was first granted on December 9, 1980.
- 2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 3911A N. 21st St, Milwaukee, WI 53206.
- 3. At all times relevant to this action, Respondent was working as a licensed practical nurse at Beverly Health Care-Kilbourn, 2125 W. Kilbourn Ave., Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
- 4. On or about December 17, 1998, Respondent utilized inappropriate volume and tone in addressing the residents assigned to her care. In addition, Respondent failed to timely complete administration of medications to all residents assigned to her on that date.
- 5. Respondent was terminated from Beverly Health Care-Kilbourn on or about December 18, 1998, based on the behavior described in paragraph 4, above.
- 6. Respondent contests the findings set forth in paragraph 4 above, but in resolution of this matter consents to the issuance of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction over this matter, pursuant to sec. 441.07, Stats.

- 2. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing is authorized to enter into the attached stipulation, pursuant to sec. 227.44(5), Stats.
- 3. The conduct described above constitutes a basis for discipline under sec. 441.07(1)(d), Stats. and Wisconsin Administrative Code § N 7.04(4). Furthermore, the Findings of Fact set forth in paragraph 4 above constitute an agency finding of abuse within the meaning of secs. 48.685 and 50.065, Stats.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the license of Pamela L. Buggs shall be LIMITED as follows:

- 1. Within nine (9) months from the date of this order, Respondent shall submit documentation of successful completion of at least twenty-four (24) hours of continuing education or other training acceptable to the Board in the areas of:
 - (a) stress/anger management;
 - (b) nursing ethics; and
 - (c) medication passing,

or in other areas acceptable to the Board as relevant to Respondent's rehabilitation. To be acceptable, the course or training shall be pre-approved by a member or designated agent of the Board of Nursing. Acceptable documentation shall include certification from the sponsoring organization as well as a statement signed by Respondent verifying that she attended the course in its entirety.

- 2. In the event that Respondent fails to timely comply with the requirements set forth in paragraph 1 above, her Wisconsin license to practice as a practical nurse shall be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until she has complied with the terms of this Order.
- 3. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the Board as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order, including receiving payment of costs and forfeitures, as well as coordinating all requests for approval of education.
