FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Georgia L. Anderson has been a CADCIH in Good Standing since August of 1998 and a CCSII in Good standing since 1/7/2000.
2. The Wisconsin Certification Board (WCB) received Ms. Anderson's CADCIH and CCSII certificates and her CADCIH identification card on 6/19/2000. These documents were received 7-10 days prior to the Board office receiving Nell Loughren's complaint.
3. The Respondent received the complaint on 7/24/2000 and was sent a follow-up letter on 9/25/2000. Telephone attempts were made and messages left on the Respondent's answering machine on 9/6 and 9/19/2000. The Respondent did not respond to this Investigator's attempts to contact her.
4. Nell Loughren, the Respondent's supervisor, was informed by the Respondent that she [Georgia L. Anderson] had an "affair" with a Recovery Center client.
5. Georgia L. Anderson resigned her position at the Recovery Center, Inc. on 6/15/2000.
6. The Respondent failed to respond or cooperate in this complaint investigation.

CONCLUSION

The Executive Committee concludes that the respondent, Georgia Anderson, breached the following Rules contained in the *Counselor Code of Conduct*:

Rule 2.2 - A counselor shall not engage in conduct which does not meet the generally accepted standards of practice.

Rule 4.1 - A counselor shall not engage in any form of sexual contact/behavior with clients, nor engage in any form of sexual contact/behavior with former therapy clients for two years after the cessation or termination of professional services within the client's continuum of care. The prohibition shall apply with respect to any client/patient of the agency by which the counselor is employed, regardless of whether or not the client/patient is on the counselor's caseload.

Rule 6.1 - A counselor shall not develop, implement, or maintain exploitative relationships with current or past clients.

Rule 11.1 - A Counselor shall cooperate in any investigation conducted pursuant to this Code of Conduct.

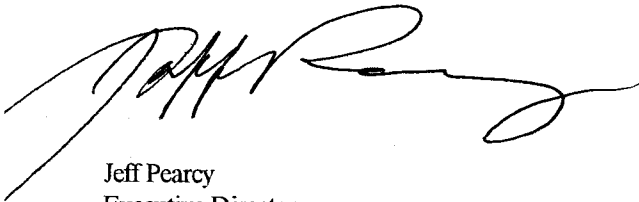
The Executive Committee concludes that the respondent, Georgia Anderson, breached the following Rules contained in the *Clinical Supervisor's Code of Conduct*:

Rule 1.4 AODA Clinical Supervisors do not engage in sexual or other harassment or exploitation of clients, students, trainees, supervisees, employees, colleagues, research subjects or actual or potential witnesses or complainants in investigations of ethical proceedings.

DECISION

Pursuant to Section V(A) 3 of the WCB Counselor Code of Conduct, Georgia Anderson's certifications as a Certified Alcohol/Drug Counselor III and Certified Clinical Supervisor II are hereby revoked. Ms. Anderson is advised of her rights to appeal, hearing, and reinstatement as outlined within the Code of Conduct, Sections VI and VII.
