ORDER GRANTING STAY

Applicant

By its Final Decision and Order dated October 30, 1992, the Board of Nursing suspended applicant's license for two years. The board's Order provided for consecutive three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon applicant's compliance with limitations placed on her license, including full participation in a drug treatment program. Because applicant failed to so participate, the suspension went into effect, and her license has been suspended since that time.

On January 29, 1999, Ms. Daschner appeared before the board in support of her petition to reinstate her license, and the board considered the request on that date. The board granted the stay by its Order dated February 7, 1999, ordering that the suspension be stayed, and that the term of the license be until Ms. Daschner completed a nursing refresher course acceptable to the board. Through clerical error, Ms. Daschner never received the Order, and she inquired as to the status of her license in May, 2000.

On May 19, 2000, the board considered Ms. Daschner's compliance with the terms of the board's Order since the time of the February, 1999, Order, which included her having completed the nurse refresher course; and considered as well Ms. Daschner's request that the suspension of her license be stayed. The board granted the stay by its Order dated June 6, 2000.

On September 1, 2000, the board considered Ms. Daschner's request for a further three month stay of the suspension, and her further request that the number of required urine screens be reduced. Based upon that request and upon other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Patricia A. Daschner, RN, to practice as a professional nurse in Wisconsin is stayed for a period of three months. Ms. Daschner may request further three month stays of the suspension of

her license, which shall be granted upon demonstration of full compliance with the terms and conditions of the board's February 7, 1999, Order during the preceding three month period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the number of required urine screens under the board's October 30, 1992, Final Decision and Order is reduced to one per month.
