AMENDED ORDER GRANTING FULL LICENSURE

On July 24, 1996, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was limited to require, among other conditions, that Dr. Stern remain in full compliance with the terms and conditions of a March, 1993 Rehabilitation Order of the Arizona Board of Medical Examiners.

On May 17, 2000, the Medical Examining Board considered Dr. Stern's request that the limitations on his license be dropped, based upon satisfaction of the rehabilitation order of the State of Arizona. Based upon the entire record in this matter, the board orders as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the license of Darryl R. Stern, M.D. to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin, is hereby reinstated to full, unlimited, status.

DISCUSSION

Following filing of the board's order reinstating Dr. Stern's unlimited license on May 17, 2000, Dr. Stern notified the board of a scrivener's error in the body of the Order whereby the name "Johnson" was inadvertently substituted for "Stern." Dr. Stern also objected to the characterization in the order that Arizona had reinstated his full license to practice in that state, contending that his license in Arizona was never limited. As a courtesy to Dr. Stern, this amended order refers to "satisfaction of the rehabilitation order of the State of Arizona" rather than to "reinstatement of his full license" in that state.
