### ORDER EXTENDING THE STAY

On July 27, 1995, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended for five years, with provision for consecutive three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain limitations on the license. Among these were that Dr. Galvani participate in a drug treatment program, one element of which was that he submit to random blood or urine screens on a twiceweekly basis.

Dr. Galvani appeared before the board pursuant to the board's Order on July 24, 1996. At that time, he petitioned the board for a reduction in the number of required urine screens, The board considered the request on that date, and granted the request by its Order dated August 3, 1998.

On November 19, 1998, February 24, 1999, and, July 22, 1999, the board considered Dr. Galvani's requests for further three month stays of the suspension of his license, and granted the stays by its Orders dated November 27, 1998, March 5, 1999 and July 27, 1999.

On November 19, 1999, and February 24, 2000, the board granted Dr. Galvani's requests for further three month stays of the suspension of his license.

On July 19, 2000, the board considered Dr. Galvani's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of his license. Based on that request, and upon all other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of Theodore J. Galvani, Jr., M.D., is hereby stayed for an additional period of three months.
