The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. Judy Marie Noel (D.O.B. 11/09/56) is duly licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a licensed practical nurse (license # 29150). This license was first granted on November 5, 1987.
- 2. Respondent's latest address on file with the Department of Regulation and Licensing is Route 4, Box 277, CTY X W9842, Crivitz, WI 54114.
- 3. At all times relevant to this action Respondent was employed as a licensed practical nurse at the Bay Area Medical Center, Marinette, Wisconsin.

- 4. During the period January, 1998, through September, 1998, Respondent wasted 48 doses of medication. The only medications wasted by Respondent were Percocet and Vicodin. Respondent's rate of wasting medications was 99 times that of other nurses working at her jobsite. In 27 instances the reason recorded for wasting was that the patient refused the medication. In 9 instances no reason was recorded. In many instances the wasting was not actually witnessed by another nurse, as required by hospital policy.
- 5. During the period January, 1998, through September, 1998, Respondent was responsible for the following discrepancies on the Controlled Substances Record. The discrepancies involved only Percocet and Vicodin, and included: 32 instances of altering dispensing times, 8 instances of missing dispensing times, 7 instances of recording patient refusing medication but then accepting the same medication within a half hour, 1 instance of recording a patient refusal and a dispensing at the same time, and 1 instance of a patient receiving the wrong medication twice in one duty shift.
- 6. Respondent acknowledges errors in wasting drugs and documentation, and denies that any of the drugs were diverted.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

By the conduct described above, Judy Marie Noel is subject to disciplinary action against her license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 441.07(1)(b), (c) and (d), and Wis. Adm. Code sec. N 7.03(1)(a), (b), (c), and N 7.04(2), (6) and (15).

#### **ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1. Judy Marie Noel is REPRIMANDED.
- 2. The license of Respondent to practice as a nurse in the state of Wisconsin is LIMITED as follows:
- a. Respondent shall certify to the Board the successful completion of an approved course of training in medication administration and documentation, within 9 months of the date of this order. Within 2 months of the date of this Order, Respondent shall submit to the Board designee an outline of the required training

for approval, which shall contain the name of the institution providing the instruction, the name of the instructor, and the course content.

Failure by Respondent to fully and timely comply with the requirements of this Order shall result in the suspension of Respondent's license to practice as a nurse without further notice or hearing, until such time as full compliance with the provisions of this Order has been attained.

- b. Until certification of completion of the required training, Respondent shall not engage in direct patient care.
- c. Until further Order of the Board, Respondent shall cause her nursing employer to provide formal written reports to the Department Monitor in the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708-8935 (telephone: 608-261-7838) on a quarterly basis, as directed by the Department Monitor. The reports shall assess Respondent's work performance.
- d. Respondent shall provide her nursing employers with a copy of this Order before engaging in any nursing employment.
- 3. The rights of a party aggrieved by this Decision to petition the Board for rehearing and to petition for judicial

review are set forth on the attached "Notice of Appeal Information".  4. This Order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.
