The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent , Yakov Ivanov (dob 05/27/51) is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a physician and surgeon licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license # 34977, first granted on November 18, 1993.
2. On 5/23/96, in Ashland County, Wisconsin, Respondent self-prescribed 40 Tylenol # 3 tablets with codeine, in violation of Wis. Stats. 961.38(5).
3. On 1/20/97, Respondent was arrested for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of drugs. A drug test revealed the presence of codeine, hydrocodone and diazepam in Respondent's blood. Respondent had valid prescriptions for the drugs from various prescribers. Respondent was convicted of OWI in the Ozaukee County Circuit Court on 2/18/97.
4. An AODA evaluation of Respondent by Dr. Raymond W. Moy, M.D., on 6/07/99 revealed no evidence of drug or alcohol abuse.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to §448.02(3), Wis. Stats. and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to §227.44(5), Wis. Stats.

6. The conduct described above violated § Med 10.02(2)(h) and (p), Wis. Adm. Code. Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the attached Stipulation is accepted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Yakov Ivanov, M.D., is REPRIMANDED for his unprofessional conduct in this matter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the license and registration of Respondent to practice as a physician and surgeon in Wisconsin is LIMITED as follows: no later than September 1, 2000, Respondent shall take and satisfactorily pass the 44 hour course in Proper Prescribing of Controlled Dangerous Substances sponsored by the Forensic and Educational Consultants of Margate, N.J., or an equivalent course which has been approved in advance by the Board. Respondent shall be responsible for all costs associated with the completion of this educational requirement. Respondent shall arrange for the course sponsor to report directly to the Department Monitor, at P.O. Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708-8935, telephone (608) 261 7938. Respondent shall authorize release of all records of attendance and performance during the course to the Department Monitor and the Board.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Respondent shall pay the cost of investigation and prosecution of this action in the sum of \$ 400.00, within 30 days of the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to §448.02(4), Wis. Stats., if the Board determines that there is probable cause to believe that respondent has violated any term of this Final Decision and Order, the Board may order that the license and registration of respondent be summarily suspended pending investigation of the alleged violation.
