On March 12, 1997, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board issued a *Final Decision and Order* in the above-captioned matter. Among the terms and conditions set forth in the board's order was that Mr. Dallman could not be employed nor work in the capacity of a "pharmacist-in-charge", as defined in Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and that his pharmacy practice must be performed in the presence of another pharmacist. By a *Modification of Order* dated October 20, 1998, the board granted a request that his practice supervision requirement be modified to permit him to practice without supervision of another pharmacist for an hour between 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. each day. By a subsequent *Modification of Order* dated May 12, 1999, the board granted a request that unsupervised practice hours be increased to a maximum of ten hours per week, with a maximum of two hours each day, with those hours not to be consecutive. By a subsequent *Modification of Order* dated November 9, 1999, the board granted a request that as part of his currently permitted 10 hours of unsupervised practice, he be allowed to work 4 consecutive hours without the supervision of another pharmacist.

On February 8, 2000, the board considered a request from Mr.Dalman for a three month stay of suspension and that the board allow him to work an additional consecutive 4 hours without the supervision of another pharmacist for a total of 8 consecutive hours. The board determined that the request should be granted.

Based upon the foregoing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Philip L. Dallman, R.Ph., may act as a pharmacist-in-charge within the meaning of section Phar 1.02 (9), Wis. Adm. Code, and thereby perform professional pharmacy services without the continuous presence and supervision of another licensed pharmacist for a maximum of twelve (12) hours per week, with no more than eight (8) hours to be consecutive on any day.
