On July 23, 1998, the Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board issued a Final Decision and Order suspending Dr. Helling's license to practice chiropractic for a period of at least two years. Dr. Helling was permitted to petition the board for termination of the suspension under certain terms and conditions.

On November 17, 2000, Attorney John B. Wolfe representing Dr. Helling petitioned the board for reinstatement. Evidence was presented that Dr. Helling underwent a psychological assessment by a Licensed Psychologist, Gary R. Schoener. Dr. Schoener recommended (1) that Dr. Helling continue to work with a psychotherapist until the psychotherapist feels that Dr. Helling has made maximal gain in his insights about relationship, and (2) that Dr. Helling attend continuing education on boundaries for at least the next two years.

IT IS ORDERED that the suspension imposed in this case on July 23, 1998 is hereby terminated and the license to practice chiropractic issued to Dr. Leif C. Helling is hereby reinstated, subject to the following limitations:

- 1. Dr. Helling shall continue to engage in psychotherapy, at Dr. Helling's expense, with Dr. Curtis Levang or another psychotherapist, to address the issues which led to the disciplinary case. Dr. Helling's treating psychotherapist shall submit in writing to the board every six months a report on Dr. Helling's participation and progress. This requirement shall continue until Dr. Helling's treating psychotherapist considers Dr. Helling to have made maximal gains in his insights into personal and professional relationships, at which time the treating psychotherapist may release Dr. Helling and report that action to the board.**
- 2. In addition to any other requirement for continuing education imposed by rule, Dr. Helling shall attend 4 hours of continuing education in boundary issues per biennium. This requirement shall continue until modified by the board.**
