This matter came before the Board on September 19, 2000, at a duly noticed meeting conducted by teleconference. The appearances at the meeting were: Arthur Thexton, Prosecuting Attorney; Theodore Nehring, Department Monitor, Craig W. Moon, respondent and Daniel P. Fay, attorney for the respondent. Based upon the Motion to Terminate Stay, the documentation provided of the results of the laboratory tests and oral argument presented at the hearing the Board makes the following order:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The current stay of suspension of the pharmacist license of respondent granted by the board is to remain in effect until the next regularly scheduled meeting of the board on October 11, 2000.
2. Based upon the stipulation of the respondent, the respondent shall not practice as a pharmacist prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the board on October 11, 2000.
3. The present hearing is adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting of the board on October 11, 2000, at which time the respondent shall have the opportunity to present evidence in opposition to the present motion to terminate the current stay of suspension in case number 97 PHM 52. All documentary evidence intended to be submitted to the board by the respondent shall be served on the prosecuting attorney, no later than seven (7) days prior to the October 11, 2000 board meeting.
4. The department monitor shall immediately arrange with the respondent to transfer the respondent to an approved drug screen facility that shall have witnessed collection of urine specimens and retain control of the chain of custody of all urine specimens for purposes of drug screening pursuant to paragraph 2b(4) of the *Final Decision and Order* in case number 97 PHM 52 entered on August 12, 1998.
