ORDER GRANTING PETITION

On March 5, 1999, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for a period of not less than two years, with provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, that she participate in psychotherapy a once weekly, and that she participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than once per week.

On March 3, 2000, the board considered Ms. Klueck's request for a three month stay of the suspension of her license. The board granted the request.

On May 19, 2000, the board considered Ms. Klueck's petition for a change in the conditions on her license to reduce the number of required urine screens and the number of required therapy sessions from one per week to one every two weeks. Based upon that request, and upon other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

<u>ORDER</u>

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the board's Final decision and Order in this matter dated March 5, 1999, is modified to reduce the number of required urine screens from once each week to one each two weeks, and to reduce the number of required therapy sessions from one per week to one every two weeks.
