ORDER GRANTING
STAY OF SUSPENSION
(MARCH, 2000)

On March 15, 2000, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed the documentation submitted in support of the request by Cory S. Ford, R.Ph., for a three-month extension of the stay of suspension, as provided within the board's *Final Decision and Order* dated March 10, 1999. The board also reviewed the documentation submitted in support of a request that the board permit work as a pharmacist in charge, and that the number of urine screens required by the *Final Decision and Order* be reduced from eight (8) to six (6) times per month.

Based upon the board's review,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Cory S. Ford, R.Ph., is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license #11082 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin. The request for a modification allowing work as a pharmacist in charge is granted with the limitation that Ford may work no more than four (4) hours per week as a pharmacist in charge, and all hours so worked must be with a co-worker present in the pharmacy. The request for a reduction in urine screens from eight (8) to six (6) times per month is granted.

Please be advised that the submission of the next quarterly reports and petition for extension of stay of suspension are due on June 1, 2000.
