Based upon Dr. Collis-Geers' failure to complete required continuing medical education by the established deadline, and based upon her failure to seek an extension until almost one month after that deadline, the board ordered that the matter be remanded to the Division of Enforcement for further action.

Dr. Collis-Geers appeared before the board at its meeting of June 22, 2000, to explain her failure to comply with the board's Order and to seek advice on locating continuing education programs complying with the board's Order. Based upon that appearance, and upon other information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that respondent shall submit to the board prior to the August 24, 2000, meeting of the Medical Examining Board proposed coursework in the area of medical ethics. Such proposed coursework need not necessarily constitute Category I continuing education credits, but must be approved in advance by the board.
