ORDER GRANTING STAY

Respondent

On September 1, 2000, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period, with provision for successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a recognized program for the treatment of chemical dependency, that he participate in psychotherapy a minimum of once each week, and that he participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in his blood or urine on a frequency of not less than once per week.

On January 12, 2001, the board considered evidence that Mr. Allen had relapsed within the preceding three months, and denied a further stay by its Order dated February 6, 2001.

On April 6, 2001, the board granted Mr. Allen's request for reinstatement of the stay based upon his full compliance with the board's Order during the preceding three month period.

On July 9, 2001, the board considered Mr. Allen's request for a further three month stay of the suspension. The board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the license of John Joseph Allen, R.N., is hereby stayed for a further period of three months. Respondent may apply for additional three month stays of the suspension upon satisfactory demonstration that he has fully complied with the board's Order during the preceding three month period.
