ORDER DENYING STAY

Respondent

On January 17, 2001, the Medical Examining Board issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin was suspended, with provision for three month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with limitations including that Dr. Propsom continue successful participation in a drug and alcohol treatment program, that he attend therapy not less than weekly, and that he submit to twice-weekly urine screens for alcohol and controlled substances. The Order required that at the time Dr. Propsom applied for his first stay, he provide evidence of having completed 30 hours of category I CME appropriate to his practice.

On April 18, the board considered Dr. Propsom's request for a stay of the suspension. The board also considered Dr. Propsom's letter of March 26, 2001, by which he disclosed that he has not completed the required continuing education. Accordingly, it is ordered as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Dr. Propsom's request for a stay of the suspension of his license is hereby denied.
