On February 2, 2001, the Board of Nursing issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter. By the terms of the board's order, respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in Wisconsin was suspended for an indefinite period, with provision for grant of successive three-month stays of the suspension conditioned upon compliance with certain conditions and limitations on the license. Among these were that respondent participate in a drug treatment program, participate in psychotherapy a minimum of four times each month, and participate in program of random witnessed monitoring for controlled substances and alcohol in her blood or urine on a frequency of not less than four times per month.

On April 6, 2001, the board granted Ms Calverly's request for a further three month stay of the suspension of her license.

On June 1, 2001, the board considered Ms. Calverly's request for a further three month stay of the suspension. The board also considered evidence that Ms. Calverly had submitted to only one urine screen in the previous three month period.

Based upon all information of record herein, the board orders as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request for a further three month stay of the suspension of the license of Patricia A. Calverly, R.N., is hereby denied. Ms. Calverly may petition for a further three month stay of the suspension upon satisfactory demonstration that she has fully complied with the terms and conditions of the board's September February 2, 2001, Final Decision and Order during the preceding three month period.
