Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the	e attached Stipulation and makes the following:
FINDINGS OF FACT	
1. Respondent Tuyen Thanh Tran, M.D. (dob	6/10/67) is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth

- 1. Respondent Tuyen Thanh Tran, M.D. (dob 6/10/67) is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a physician and surgeon licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license #34583, first granted on 7/1/93. Respondent is an emergency medicine physician.
- 2. Respondent did, from 1995-97, prescribe hydrocodone, a Schedule III controlled substance, and oxycodone, a Schedule II controlled substance, to various immediate and extended family members, without keeping any kind of health care chart or record. Approximately 6,000 dosage units were so prescribed.
- 3. Respondent's prescribing included the writing of prescriptions purportedly to other persons, and having those persons fill the prescriptions at pharmacies, following which the medications would be forwarded to members of respondent's immediate and extended.
- 4. As a result of the above activity, respondent has entered into a pretrial diversion agreement with the United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, for 18 months following July, 2000.
- 5. Respondent's prescribing of these medications was in part for lower back pain caused by repetitive lifting of heavy objects and loads in a work environment. Other prescribing was for what respondent diagnosed as migraine headaches. While in some cases, opioids may be appropriate short term treatment for these conditions, in most cases such treatment is not appropriate. Respondent has no records or other documentation to show that such treatment was appropriate here.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

A. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to §448.02(3), Wis. Stats. and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to §227.44(5), Wis. Stats.

B. The conduct described in paragraph 2, above, violated § Med 10.02(2)(a), Wis. Adm. Code. The conduct described in paragraph 3, above, violated § Med 10.02(2)(p), Wis. Adm. Code. The conduct described in paragraph 5, above, violated § Med 10.02(2)(h), Wis. Adm. Code, and was negligence in treatment. Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the attached Stipulation is accepted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Tuyen T. Tran, M.D., is REPRIMANDED for his unprofessional conduct in this matter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that respondent shall, no later than 12/31/01, take and satisfactorily complete the following CME courses, which shall be pre-approved by the Board's monitoring liaison, and be of the seminar-type (as opposed to home-study):

A 40 or more hour CME course in appropriate prescribing of controlled substances.

An 8 or more hour CME course in diagnosis and treatment of migraine and other headaches.

Respondent shall cause the course sponsors to release all records relating to his attendance and performance to the Board and its staff, and authorize the sponsors and course staff to discuss his performance with the Board and its staff.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that respondent shall pay the costs of investigating and prosecuting this matter in the amount of \$300, within 30 days of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to §448.02(4), Wis. Stats., if the Board determines that there is probable cause to believe that respondent has violated any term of this Final Decision and Order, the Board may order that the license and registration of respondent be summarily suspended pending investigation of the alleged violation.
