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Findings of Fact

1. On October 22, 2001, James E. Polewski, on behalf of the division of enforcement, filed a motion to dismiss stating he made a credibility determination regarding witness statements in light of Ms. Brandl's answer, the material in the division's file and a conversation with Ms. Brandl.
2. James E. Polewski no longer believes that there is sufficient credible evidence to support a finding of unprofessional conduct against Ms. Brandl, as charged in the complaint.

Conclusions of Law

1. The board of nursing has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07.
2. The respondent has not violated Wis. Stat. § 441.07 or Wis. Admn. Code § N 7.04.

1. The complaint is hereby dismissed.
